Audrey Wong, ANCER, LASALLE College of the Arts, Singapore

Audrey Wong is Programme Leader of the MA Arts and Cultural Leadership course at LASALLE College of the Arts. The first Nominated Member of Parliament for the Arts in Singapore (2009 – 2011), Audrey was also previously Artistic Co-director of The Substation and served on boards of institutions like the National Arts Council, Singapore Art Museum and Nine Years Theatre.



To realize her dream, mastering the art of arts management, Linda took an early retirement as dancer and earned her MA from Columbia University. She has taught at the Jakarta Institute for the Arts; co-founded Kelola, and Indonesia's arts coalition, Koalisi Seni. She also serves on the Board of Filantropi Indonesia.

Mio Yachita (MA/Ms./she/her), Researcher, Japan

Mio is a researcher, arts coordinator and a translator, currently researching on indigenous cultural policy of Japan. She served as a head of cultural department in Japan Foundation Malaysia (2012-2016), and taught at the Tokyo University of the Arts (2016-2020), before moving back to her home prefecture Hokkaido to focus on indigenous topics as a non-indigenous researcher.

With a decade-long career as a performer, director, and producer at B-Floor Theatre, Sasapin is a core member who has gained expertise in movement-based performance practices. She holds the position of Artistic Director of Bangkok International Performing Arts Meeting (BIPAM) since 2018 and works as an independent theatre artist and international touring producer
