



Getting to CUHK and the Hyatt Regency Hotel from Hong Kong International Airport

By Taxi	<p>Follow the signs at the airport to the taxi rank, and there should be a member of the airport staff to help direct you – you just need to tell them your destination. You can show this page to the taxi driver or member of staff.</p> <p>The fare is about HK\$350-400 (including surcharges for luggage and tunnel tolls). Taxis do not accept credit card or Octopus Card payment. Most taxi drivers in Hong Kong understand some English. The trip from the Airport to the CUHK campus takes about 45 minutes, and will be the easiest option if you have a lot of luggage or heavy luggage.</p>
By MTR	<p>At the airport, you can buy an Octopus card, which you will then be able to use for all public transport and many shops/services during your stay in Hong Kong. You will have to pay a 50HKD deposit plus the amount you add for its use during your trip. You can always top this up further, later on.</p> <p>You can then take the Airport Express to Hong Kong Station, walk a little (approx. 10 minutes) and change to the Island Line towards Chai Wan or the Tsuen Wan Line towards Tsuen Wan, where you will change trains at Admiralty to take the East Rail Line – then you'll just get off at University Station, where the Hyatt Regency Hotel is opposite Exit B.</p> <p>This will cost less than 150HKD and take approx. 65mins.</p>
By Bus	<p>Follow the steps above to get an Octopus card.</p> <p>Then, you can take the A41 bus and get off at Tai Wai Station, where you will change to the MTR East Rail Line towards Lo Wu/Lok Ma Chau, where you'll get off at University Station, where the Hyatt Regency Hotel is opposite Exit B.</p> <p>This is the cheapest option, but not advisable if you have a lot of luggage. This takes around 1hr 15mins.</p>

CUHK Parking Coupon

1. Enter the campus parking areas by using your own Octopus card and park your vehicle.
2. Get 1-2 parking coupons from Nocus YUNG / Fancy FAN on 12-13 December 2025.
3. Exit the campus by tapping 1-2 parking coupons before tapping your octopus card.

Entering the Campus

To enter the CUHK campus, go to:

- Exit A of the University MTR Station. On your left, you will see a security booth, go there and follow the instructions on the right of this slide.
- Exit D of the University MTR Station. On your right, you will see a security booth, go there and follow the instructions on the right of this slide.
- Exit C of the University MTR station. Go down the stairs, escalator, or lift, and there will be a security booth directly in front of you. Go there and follow the instructions on the right of this slide.

At the entrance:

Method 1:

Use the QR codes provided by our centre. Each visitor will receive a QR code from our Centre for each day and each QR code is valid only for 1 day. There are 2 separate QR codes for 12 and 13 December, 2025

Method 2:

Use your Hong Kong Identity Card / Passports

This will also get you on campus, but will take longer. You may tell the security staff that you are going to YIA for a conference.

- [Shatin New Town Plaza Mall](#): take the MTR two stops south to Shatin.
 - Simply Life (sandwiches) SHOP 129 L1 PHASE I
 - Starbucks: SHOP 155 L1 PHASE I
 - Din Tai Fung (Taiwanese xiao long bao dumplings, etc.): SHOP 166 L1 PHASE I
 - Lei Garden (dim sum, best to make a reservation): SHOP 633 L6 PHASE I

 - City Super (upscale supermarket): SHOP 204-214 L2 PHASE I
- Tai Po Public Market: take the MTR one stop north to Tai Po Market.
